Blythedale Children's Hospital is dedicated to improving the health and quality of life of children, birth through age 19, with medical complexity. As one of only 19 pediatric specialty hospitals in the US, Blythedale has the combined staff, expertise and resources to provide exceptional comprehensive care for medically complex children and support for their families – including multi-disciplinary care, teaching, research and advocacy programs. 75% of Blythedale's patients are dependent on Medicaid making the Hospital a vital resource to some of the region's sickest and poorest children. It is the first hospital in the United States to develop a post-NICU/PICU program and is New York State's only children's hospital with its own K-12 public school district on site. Blythedale's ultimate goal is to help their patients return to their families and communities.



Project A.B.L.E. (Aid on Behalf of Literacy and Education) is a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting literacy and providing educational opportunities for children and their families in the developing world. Project A.B.L.E. invests in discrete projects – typically funding the construction and/or operation of schools, libraries, and educational centers – that are then operated and managed by members of the local community, with whom the program deals with directly. In this way, Project A.B.L.E. can closely monitor how their funds are allocated, develop personal and sustainable relationships with project leaders, and provide the local community with a strong sense of ownership and investment in the continued success of their projects.



In 2009, Project A.B.L.E. opened their first project - a library community center in the village of Imbaseni in Tanzania, East Africa. The center also serves as a library, hosting wellness events, film nights and traditional art gatherings.

The Mathare Education Center is a community-based school located in the Mathare slum in Nairobi, Kenya. The school serves over 450 children orphaned or from single parent families decimated by AIDs and poverty, and is a community center for a population of 5,000 people.



The Kenya Education Fund will provide high school scholarships for graduates of the Mathere Education Center, including school fees, uniforms and learning materials. Scholarships include mentoring and career guidance workshops.

In honor of Yeardeley Love



The Yeardeley Reynolds Love Foundation was created in 2010 to honor the memory of Yeardeley Love, a UVA senior who was beaten to death by her ex-boyfriend just weeks short of graduation. The Foundation is more popularly known as One Love, with “One” representing the number that Yeardeley wore on her jersey during her high school and college lacrosse career. Today, One Love’s goal is to end relationship violence by engaging young people in a movement for change. They develop compelling educational content that sparks discussions and inspires young people to work together to affect change in their communities.



The Escalation Workshop is a catalyst for the One Love Movement - educating students about the warning signs of abuse, empowering them to speak out, and activating them to make change in their communities.

This 90-minute workshop consists of an award-winning film, **Escalation**, that takes you through a college relationship—from its exciting beginnings to its tragic end—followed by a guided discussion.

Yeardeley Love

In December 2014, three college lacrosse players decided to run one million yards during preseason training to raise awareness of relationship violence. They called this campaign **Yards for Yeardeley**.

Within one day, 8 teams joined the campaign. Within one week, it was up to 40. The final number? Over 150 Division I, II, and III schools have dedicated their preseason to this cause.

To date, over 75 million yards have been run. The campaign is ongoing, with students logging more yards every day.
